Position Summary: The Veterinarian position provides prompt and quality veterinary services to all animals within the organization's care and works collaboratively with the medical team. It requires a working knowledge of epidemiology, shelter medicine and surgical proficiency.

Qualifications: We are looking for a self-motivated, compassionate veterinarian that has a passion for providing the highest level of care to animals and a demonstrated aptitude in clinical medicine and surgery.

Position Responsibilities:

- Provide medical services to all animals at the Rhode Island SPCA, including but not limited to, physical examinations, diagnostics, and treatment of shelter animals.
- Responsible for providing medical services to the general public through the Marvin Fund, a program that serves pet owners in need, in a courteous and professional manner.
- Responsible for overseeing dietary needs of all animals in the care of the Society.
- Responsible for maintaining current veterinary records on all animals in the care of the Society.
- Responsible for keeping up-to-date on current medical practices, laws and procedures.
- Perform sterilization surgeries and other surgical procedures for shelter animals.
- Development, documentation, and maintenance of Shelter Medicine Program Protocols.
- Perform euthanasia within the animal shelter and through the Marvin Fund.
- Responsible for assisting in cruelty investigations to include performing gross necropsies when necessary, proper documentation and courtroom testimony.
- Responsible for maintaining an adequate and current supply of medication.
- Provide emergency care to sick or injured animals at the Rhode Island SPCA.
- Adhere to DEA requirements for controlled drugs.
- Maintain appropriate licensing and complete continuing education courses.
- Properly maintain and utilize all hospital equipment.
- Assist the President in developing and adhering to an annual budget for the medical program.
- Responsible for making shelter animal euthanasia recommendations to the President, based upon medical related concerns.
- Responsible for documenting and reporting any behavioral concerns of animals noted during medical examinations or daily rounds, to the Behavior Manager.
- Perform other duties as required to insure a positive public image and to improve the functioning of the organization.



Education / Work Experience:

- Graduate of an accredited school of veterinary medicine or equivalent.
- Licensed to practice veterinary medicine in the state of Rhode Island in good standing and must complete all professional requirements to maintain licensure.
- DEA license must be current or obtainable.
- Minimum of 3 - 5 years working in a veterinary clinic or equivalent required. Shelter and high-volume, high-quality veterinary and/or spay-neuter clinic experience is preferred.
- Fear-Free Certification desired.
- Excellent surgical skills required. Ability to conduct high-volume, high-quality surgical sterilizations in a fast-paced environment.
- Basic computer literacy required. Familiarity with Shelter Luv desired.
- Proven and effective organizational and communication skills.
- Must have a sincere interest in the mission, vision and culture of the Rhode Island SPCA.

Compensation: This is a full-time position that reports directly to the President. The Rhode Island SPCA offers a competitive salary. The benefit package includes company paid Health Insurance, paid time off and holidays, employee profit sharing plan and four weeks' paid vacation.
